Computer Science Trip


Year 9 Tech students visited the University of Liverpool for a Computer Science taster day. The interactive day was run by staff and students from the University, with workshops on artificial intelligence, encryption and algorithms, finishing with robotics.






Electron Micrograph Projects

This week our students used an Electron Micrograph which was taken at x2000 magnification. The diatoms pictured (below left) are from around 2.5 million years ago and have a 'shell' made of silica, a substance like coloured glass, which leads them to being known as "Opals of the sea". They are photosynthetic single celled organisms which are responsible for removing carbon dioxide and producing oxygen and our students at Liverpool Life Sciences are hoping to find living samples in water from the River Mersey.





Students also looked at symbiotic culture of yeast and bacteria (SCOBY) with SCOBY'S being used to brew the drink Kombucha. We can see the cellulose, which the bacteria have made (circled) and a variety of microorganisms. Some are the right size to be yeast (eg 5um) and some to be bacteria (1um). The project is being run by Year 12 Medicine candidates as SCOBY's are a potential treatment for burns and we will vary the food we feed the SCOBY and see how it affects growth.
